Middle School Youth Ministry Core Team. We are re-launching the Middle School Youth Ministry (MSYM) programs with two separate groups: a 5th & 6th grade group and a 7th & 8th grade group. We need adults who have a passion for developing the faith and fellowship lives of these young people in a fun, supportive, and nurturing environment. As September draws to a close, we reflect on National Suicide Prevention Month. During this month, the SGG Mental Wellness Ministry hosted two significant events to enhance our community's understanding of faith-based support for those with mental health challenges and to honor individuals affected by suicide. The educational event on September 11th, Bridging the Gap: How Faith and Action Can Support Mental Health and Well-Being, featured Deacon Ed Shoener, founding member and president of the Association of Catholic Mental Health Ministers. Deacon Ed spoke about his personal experience of suicide loss, and offered insights on how we can provide support to those living with mental health issues. On September 14th, the SGG family was invited to worship together at a Mass for Suicide Healing and Remembrance to honor families and friends who have lost loved ones to suicide and to prayerfully remember and cherish those who have died. Both of these events were warmly embraced by the SGG family, with many participating and contributing to their success. If we take a minute to think, what do those words really mean for us? Jesus loved us no matter who we were, what our title was, or even how far down into the depths we had fallen. He loved us enough to lay down His life for us. So how does that command translate for us in this day, this month, this year of 2024? It begins in our hearts and radiates outward to every person we see – with no exceptions. It goes beyond our family, our church family, our neighborhood and our political affiliations. It circles the globe and sees every person as a brother or sister in Christ. We are not called to agree or approve, rather we are simply called to love.

The timing of our annual Pledge of Nonviolence at IHM couldn't be better, as strife and discord appear to be rising to unprecedented levels. As part of the Respect Life weekend (October 5 and 6) we will again pause and pray together, asking God to help us become instruments of peace. Now is the time for us to turn inward and ask Jesus to give us an attitude of peace we can carry into the world around us. It won't be easy, there will be challenges everywhere we go, but we know Our Lord has promised He "will never leave us or forsake us."

The pledge will be projected on the screens at IHM and we will say it together as the closing prayer of the petitions.

Prayer for Nonviolence

Loving God, I come before you, trying to be gentle and nonviolent, wanting our world to be more just and more peaceful. Strengthen in me the desire to follow the call of Jesus, who taught us "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons and daughters of God."

Help me to model my life on the way of Jesus, by striving for peace within myself and seeking to be a peacemaker in my daily life; by embracing and promoting a consistent respect for all life as Your creation; by seeking to avoid hurting others, asking forgiveness when I do, and forgiving those who hurt me; by giving encouragement to others and showing deep respect even when we disagree; by making choices in my life-style that protect the earth and honor the needs of all people; by challenging violence in all its forms whenever I encounter it, whether at home, at work or school, in our community or in the world; and by standing with others who are treated unjustly and abused.

Deepen in me Your compassion, that I may grow ever more faithful in following Your way of love,

Amen.
