October is Respect Life Month; a time to join together as one Catholic Church to defend the dignity of all human life, from the time we are knit together in our mothers' wombs until we take our final breaths, each moment of our lives is a gift from God. Each year the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops designates the first Sunday of October as the beginning of an annual Respect Life program.

Today the gift of life is threatened in countless ways. Those who are most vulnerable, rather than receiving the protection they deserve, are all too often seen as a burden and as expendable. As new attacks on human life continue to emerge, we can be tempted to despair, but Christ instead offers us hope. St. Gregory the Great Mental Wellness Minute

In November 2023, the USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops introduced this Novena for Mental Health for all the people of God to join together in prayer for those experiencing or impacted by mental health issues and for those who accompany them. It can be prayed at any time of year, but the entire Church is encouraged to pray this Novena in solidarity with one another from October 10 to October 18. October 10 is World Mental Health Day and this nationwide moment of prayer fittingly concludes on the feast of Saint Luke, patron saint of health care, on October 18.

Each day of the Novena reflects on a theme related to mental health, or a particular population significantly affected by mental health challenges, using a "Pray, Learn, Act" structure.

IN OUR COMMUNITY

Love one another as I have loved you

It is likely we can all recite the two great commandments – Love God with all our heart, all our soul and all our mind, and love our neighbor as our self. But when Jesus told us to love one another as He had loved us, things were taken to a much higher level.

If we take a minute to think, what do those words really mean for us? Jesus loved us no matter who we were, what our title was, or even how far down into the depths we had fallen. He loved us enough to lay down His life for us. So how does that command translate for us in this day, this month, this year of 2024? It begins in our hearts and radiates outward to every person we see – with no exceptions.

It goes beyond our family, our church family, our neighborhood and our political affiliations. It circles the globe and sees every person as a brother or sister in Christ. We are not called to agree or approve, rather we are simply called to love.

The timing of our annual Pledge of Nonviolence at IHM couldn't be better, as strife and discord appear to be rising to unprecedented levels. As part of the Respect Life weekend (October 5 and 6) we will again pause and pray together, asking God to help us become instruments of peace. Now is the time for us to turn inward and ask Jesus to give us an attitude of peace we can carry into the world around us. It won't be easy, there will be challenges everywhere we go, but we know Our Lord has promised He "will never leave us or forsake us."

The pledge will be projected on the screens at IHM and we will say it together as the closing prayer of the petitions.

Prayer for Nonviolence

Loving God, I come before You, trying to be gentle and nonviolent, wanting our world to be more just and more peaceful. Strengthen in me the desire to follow the call of Jesus, who taught us "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons and daughters of God."

Help me to model my life on the way of Jesus, by striving for peace within myself and seeking to be a peacemaker in my daily life; by embracing and promoting a consistent respect for all life as Your creation; by seeking to avoid hurting others, asking forgiveness when I do, and forgiving those who hurt me; by giving encouragement to others and showing deep respect even when we disagree; by making choices in my lifestyle that protect the earth and honor the needs of all people; by challenging violence in all its forms whenever I encounter it, whether at home, at work or school, in our community or in the world; and by standing with others who are treated unjustly and abused.

Deepen in me Your compassion, that I may grow ever more faithful in following Your way of love,

Amen.


