Welcome

Reflections & Ruminations... by Fr. Steve Angi

As human beings, we have a tendency to avoid thinking, talking about, and planning for death. For many, death is their greatest fear. They fear much will be left behind not to mention the mysteriousness of death. We have so many amenities and conveniences and so much sheltering that we rarely encounter the natural phenomenon of death all around us, from the animal and plant kingdoms to the birth and death of galaxies and stars. Because of our anxieties and fears, we revert to avoidance and denial. It can be a tough and painful topic, especially if we've lost those close to us or faced grave illnesses ourselves or among loved ones. Conceptually, we know death is inevitable but that doesn't make it easier to face. In ancient Rome, acknowledging death as an inescapable reality of human existence was seen as a means of promoting humility and wisdom. The Stoics of ancient Greece and Rome encouraged people to contemplate their mortality, because they believed that doing so would lead to a more virtuous and meaningful life.

The month of November in the Church seems to be a month of remembering the dead as All Souls Day is celebrated on November 2. Guardian Angels remembers the deceased over the past year at the 7 pm Mass on All Saints Day, St. John Fisher remembers on Sunday, November 3 at the 11 am Mass, and Immaculate Heart of Mary remembers in a special Mass on Wednesday, November 6 as November 2 in 2024 is a Saturday. We remember as a family of parishes all those who have gone before us this past year and pray for them and their family and friends who have been grieved by their passing.

The Roles of Deacons

Our St. Gregory the Great family of parishes is blessed to have eleven deacons who assist our priests in many ways. In addition to serving during the celebration of the Mass, our deacons are actively involved across the parish family's ministries of formation, sacramental preparation, vocational and spiritual guidance, worship and liturgical commissions, and much more. Most of these men have full-time jobs outside the Church and they have families with children and grandchildren locally and across the United States. When ordained, they make an oath of obedience to the Archbishop and so our deacons serve and minister at Archdiocesan liturgies and programs, at the Seminary and as chaplains for hospitals, nursing homes and cemeteries. The Archdiocese of Cincinnati's Office of the Diaconate recently published a survey highlighting the activities and ministries that deacons directly offer and support. The Book of Gospels

If you go to weekend Mass at IHM, you may have noticed the deacon is now carrying a big red book in the entrance procession. He places it on the altar and before the Gospel Reading, he picks it up and brings it to the ambo. This book is called The Book of Gospels, and it contains the Gospel Readings for Mass. We recognize the proclamation of the Gospel Reading to be the high point of the Liturgy of the Word because we believe that Christ speaks to us at that moment. One way of showing reverence to this moment is the use of a different book from which the readings are proclaimed, known as the Lectionary. As a congregation we change our posture from sitting to standing out of respect for this moment.

While the deacon carries it in the entrance procession, you will notice that he does not carry it in the exit procession. This is because we have just been instructed to "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord." Each of us is to bear the good news of the Gospel as we take leave from Mass! A final detail to note is that this was already being done at Guardian Angels and St. John Fisher. By making the change at IHM we bring unity to the way our Family of Parishes celebrates Mass.

As long as certain requirements are met, QCDs can fulfill your required minimum distribution (RMD), avoid paying income tax on the distribution, and provide a significant gift to support the work and mission of our parish. A few points when considering an IRA QCD: the donor must be 70½ years old or older. the distribution must transfer directly from your IRA to a qualified charitable organization, each individual in a married couple can donate up to \$100,000 from individual IRA accounts. Note: the gift would not be eligible for a charitable income tax deduction. Please consult your tax adviser to determine if this charitable giving strategy is an option for you.
