Reflections & Ryminations... by Fr. Steve Angi

In my first two assignments as a priest, there were religious sisters in both of the parishes. Sr. Pat was a Director of Religious Education, Sr. Mary Ellen and Sr. Judy were pastoral associates. They were dedicated religious sisters to their orders and to the parishes. Sr. Judy was a real collaborator as in my second assignment a few months after arriving, the pastor had a heart attack and open heart surgery. With the pastor gone for months, I relied heavily on Sr. Judy and her pastoral knowledge. With over 40 weddings a year, numerous funerals and five Sunday Masses, it was a real balancing act. It is religious sisters like these who we remember and fondly cherish.

This weekend, the second collection is for the Retirement Fund for Religious. Across the United States, hundreds of religious communities lack financial resources sufficient to meet the retirement and health care needs of aging members. Historically, Catholic sisters, brothers, and religious order priests—known collectively as women and men religious—received very little pay. Any surplus funds were reinvested in ministry and the education of younger members. As a result, hundreds of US religious communities lack adequate retirement savings. Like many Americans, religious communities face the monumental challenge of funding eldercare. Currently, the average annual cost of care for women and men religious past age 70 is nearly \$60,000 per person. Skilled care averages \$90,700. The total cost of care for senior women and men religious in the United States has exceeded \$1 billion annually for each of the last 16 years.

During the early and mid-twentieth centuries, the Catholic Church in the United States experienced a surge in vocations to religious life, with numbers peaking in the mid-1960s. Care for elderly members was provided largely by younger ones. Over time, however, the number of vocations decreased while lifespans increased. The result is far fewer younger members available to support the retirement and eldercare needs of senior members. Currently, 71 percent of the religious communities have a median age of 70 or older.




Volunteers needed for winter weekend trip to St. Vincent Mission


Advent Holy Hour of Prayer

What is 9-8-8?

The national 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline provides 24/7, free, and confidential support for individuals in crisis. This important Lifeline can be reached by dialing or texting 9-8-8 or online at 988lifeline.org. Anyone who is experiencing a suicidal, mental health, or substance use crisis can connect with a trained counselor at one of more than 200 call centers. Counselors are prepared to aid in various crisis situations and to help create safety plans; they can also connect callers to resources or refer them to local mental health care providers. They are trained to only call the police as a last resort, when it is necessary to save a person's life. Since its launch in mid-2022, 9-8-8 has received more than 11 million calls, texts, and chats, with rates now exceeding a half million each month. St. Gregory the Great **Christmas Cookies for Justice**

Transforming Jail Ministries volunteer chaplains deliver more than 1,200 dozen cookies of homemade goodness to all of the jail facilities in Hamilton County, Ohio on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. Each incarcerated person receives a bag of cookies and assurance that someone is thinking about and praying for them over the holidays. A similar thing is done for Corrections Officers a few days earlier. Our IHM prison ministry team asks for your help in baking and packing. If you are interested in helping to pack the cookies on December 19 or 20, please call Sherrie Heyse at 513-843-7188. If possible, decorate the cookies to look festive! While baking, please pray for the incarcerated and corrections officers.

Examples: 1. Chocolate chip or sugar cookies with sprinkles, decorated cut sugar cookies, colored M&Ms. 2. Oatmeal with raisins or Craisins, or any regular sized cookie. Regular size is approximately 2-3", so that we can fit 6 cookies comfortably in a zip lock sandwich bag when we pack them. Uniformity is desired so that everyone feels the same amount of appreciation. In other words, please avoid baking any cookies that could create jealousy between inmates (candy, fudge, etc.). Allow cookies to cool and dry completely before delivering, do not deliver in plastic bags. Tins and containers cannot be returned so please do not send us valuable containers you would like to receive back.

Drop off at the GA, IHM or SJF church office by Thursday morning, December 19. Pick up is at 12 pm.

Charitable Giving

It's already December, which means the end of the year will be here before you know it. Of course that also means the window of opportunity to make a financial contribution for the 2024 tax year is rapidly closing. Donations made by cash or check are by far the most common methods of charitable giving. However, contributing stocks, bonds, or mutual funds that have appreciated over time has become increasingly popular in recent years, and for good reasons. There are a number of charitable planning strategies that can help you lower your taxes this year. Here are some ways to shift your taxable income to a charitable donation for Guardian Angels, Immaculate Heart of Mary, or St. John Fisher:

Outright Gift of Stock

Make a gift by transferring (not selling) stock directly to one of our three churches and avoid paying capital gains on the transfer and receive a tax-saving charitable deduction for the market value of the stock as of the date of the transfer.

IRA Charitable Rollover (Qualified Charitable Distribution)

If you are 70 ½ or older, you can transfer up to \$100,000 from your IRA account directly to GA, IHM, or SJF. Because the rollover counts against your required minimum distribution, this could reduce your taxable income. Although you won't receive a charitable tax deduction, you won't pay any income tax on the transfer either.
