Reflections & Ryminations... by Fr. Steve Angi

In this age of dislocation, when people around the globe are on the move, fleeing violence, crushing poverty and despair, the Feast of the Epiphany today presents us with another tale of a journey- a journey of faith and hope. Scripture tells us little about the travelers, these Magi from the East, who set out bearing gifts for a newborn king, based on their knowledge of prophecy and omens in the sky. The magi had a higher aim; they did not come to learn from a human king but to pay homage to a divine one. The Feast of Epiphany, this journey of the Magi, reminds us that the Spirit of God, who was breathed out over the waters at creation, continues to move among us to love, call and enlighten all who are open to God's presence. This Spirit moved the Magi to give away their material possessions as they searched for something more real, more profound. God's Spirit is not confined to any individual, any people, any church building, no matter how magnificent. Notice, it is not King Herod, the scribes or the temple priests of Israel who recognize or worship the newborn king, but outsiders, foreigners. If we shut our doors and our hearts to people of difference, like Herod or the infamous innkeepers of Bethlehem did, we might miss a chance to welcome bearers of God's Spirit and God's Word. We encounter a better role model in Mary of Nazareth, who welcomed these unfamiliar guests and their unusual gifts rather than turn them away. It is easy to imagine this humble woman "reflecting on" and "treasuring" this visit, as she did the night she received her first unexpected visitors, a band of impoverished shepherds from the hillsides near Bethlehem singing God's praises and speaking of angels. This Feast encourages us to reflect on how we can be welcoming to all peoples in our family of parishes, our circle of friends and in our hearts.

One of the goals of our St. Gregory the Great Family of Parishes is to host events that will attract at least 300 parishioners from our three churches. Planning has begun to host one of these events on March 15th, 2025, under the banner of a St. Gregory the Great Day of Service.

This day will consist of five service projects with our parishioners supplying the labor to provide meals, food, toiletry kits, and diapers to area food pantries and other nonprofits.

Here is a brief description of the activities:

- 1. We will execute an assembly line production of macaroni and cheese meals. We will take bulk items and pack them into 25,000 individual meals.
- 2. We will collect diapers of all sizes and break them down into smaller packages that will be distributed by the Care Closet in Newport, Kentucky.
- 3. We will pack needed hygiene item kits for men and women to be distributed at various homeless shelters.
- 4. We will pack healthy food "power packs" that will be distributed to various schools and clubs by Inter Parish Ministry (IPM).
- 5. We will pack bags filled with feminine products, lotion, and hand sanitizer for the "Never the Less" organization that provides programs for at risk 6th – 11th grade girls in the Tri-State area.




