# Reflections & Ruminations... by Fr. Steve Angi

We live in times of violence. The violence of bigotry. The violence of exclusion. The violence of exploitation. The violence of indifference. Tomorrow as the nation celebrates the legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., he moved away from the notion that some are more entitled or more privileged than others. He gave his life to the idea that the least of us is deserving of love, respect, and equality. The goal of establishing such a community remains a worthy one. Dr. Martin Luther King lived his life out loud, inviting us into his struggles and fears. No matter how much he was extolled and celebrated, he expressed no scorn for others. Humility guided his steps and respect for others illumined his way. His questioning and thoughtfulness did not diminish him; it elevated him even further as a leader.

Many people fear that we may be moving backward as a nation. What are we to do? Dr. King showed us a way forward instead of a way backward, and his teachings point the way for us. First, he taught us how to be exacting in our expectations of ourselves. Like King, we must rid ourselves of hatred of the other. In the face of death threats and bombings, Dr. King was optimistic. In the face of jailings, Dr. King was optimistic. In the face of "bitter and dangerous adversaries," Dr. King was optimistic. What we must do is to remain optimistic because we are engaged in the struggle to improve lives. What we must do is remain hopeful because we are actively working to surmount obstacles to equality and justice. We must respond by clearing our own hearts of hate.

King was a beacon to the young people of his day. We cannot be the giant that he was but we can speak the truth to power and privilege, claiming the voice that Dr. King called on us to raise in the service of humanity. We can show courage when the rights of others are being denied or stolen. We can be unwavering in our support of love for all people. It is his example that challenges us to renew our commitment to a just world for which he fought and died.

## Martin Luther King Jr.


In observance of Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, Most Reverend Timothy P. Broglio of the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA, and president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has issued a statement (2024):

On Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day we pause and reflect on Rev. King's indelible legacy, and his rallying cry in the pursuit of justice and peace.

As Rev. King taught us, we must confront the evils of racism and prejudice with the love of Christ: 'Deeply etched in the fiber of our religious tradition is the conviction that men are made in the image of God . . . the heirs of a legacy of dignity and worth. . . This call for a worldwide fellowship that lifts neighborly concern beyond one's tribe, race, class, and nation is in reality a call for an all-embracing and unconditional love for all men.'

Each of us can and must work for justice and peace, remembering Rev. King's call to action: 'Life's most persistent and urgent question is, 'What are you doing for others?'

Martin Luther King, Jr., was a champion of civil rights. Dr. King used the Word of God to effect change of hearts and minds. Given the issues of migration, antisemitism and racial and religious discrimination touching our communities, we are reminded that the work of bringing people together in mutual recognition and cooperation is never really done. There remain forces in the human condition that would tear asunder what has been accomplished. Let us remain vigilant to take advantage of positive signs existing in evangelization efforts and continued civic progress within human relations. These things help shape communities that manifest the affirmative outcomes arising from our varied races, ethnicities, and cultural backgrounds. The Catholic Church is committed to this endeavor and willingly clasps hands and hearts with all others of like mind, faith, and hope.

## Bible Study at St. John Fisher starts February 18th

St. John Fisher will offer *The Bible Timeline: The Story of Salvation by Ascension*. This study is a program that takes us on a guided journey through salvation history. Presenter Jeff Cavins will show us how fourteen of the Bible's narrative books tell the biblical story from beginning to end and will give us the keys to understanding the amazing story woven throughout Scripture. It will show us how to read and understand the entire Bible and introduce us to the wonderful narrative of Scripture in a way that will transform your life.

The study, co-led by Deacon Tom Gaier, Connie Wehmeyer, and Marty Rauen, is 25 sessions and will start with an introduction to the bible on February 18th at 10:00 am in the Resurrection Room at St. John Fisher. We will then do 12 weekly sessions with Jeff Cavins starting February 25 and finish in May. The subsequent 12 sessions will begin again in the fall and complete the study. There is no requirement that you attend all 25 sessions, or that you only sign up for the spring sessions but not the fall. However, it will be most fruitful to attend both sessions.

The total cost for the materials is \$45.00 which includes the workbook, the bible timeline chart, and a bible timeline bookmark. Catholic Charities of Southwest Ohio (CCSW) welcomes refugees escaping persecution, war and violence in their homelands and empowers them to build new lives and become self-sufficient. Currently, they are working with families from Syria, Ukraine, Democratic Republic of Congo, and a handful of other countries. CCSW has found apartments for several of these families but need help outfitting them with some of the basics.

The weekends of February 16 and 23, we will be collecting kitchen, bathroom and bedroom basics to help these families settle in. Think of it like an old-fashioned bridal shower!

A list of suggested items will be published in an upcoming bulletin. Some of the items should be new, but some can be gently used. (C'mon, when was the last time you used that stock pot? And do you really need ALL those plastic storage containers?) Items can be dropped off in Pater Hall at St. John Fisher.

Please give some serious thought to how you can begin the new year by welcoming the strangers in our city – it could just be the Lord!

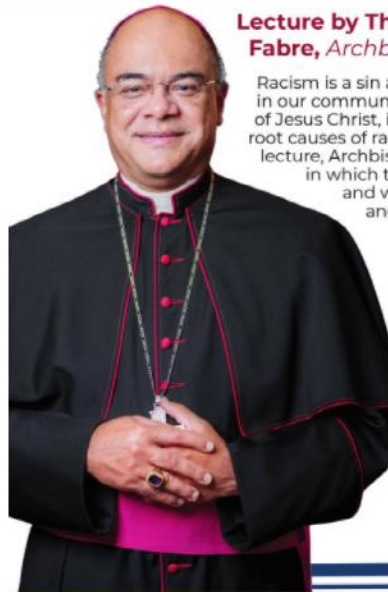
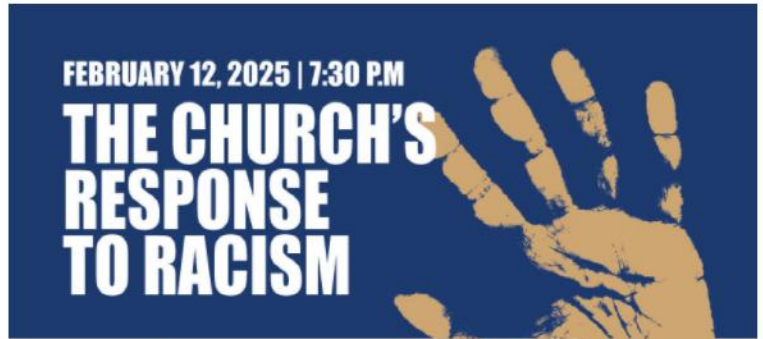

## **VOLUNTEER WITH US! St. Gregory the Great Day of Service | March 15**



One of the goals of our St. Gregory the Great Family of Parishes is to host events that will attract at least 300 parishioners from our three churches. Planning has begun to host one of these events on March 15th, 2025, under the banner of a St. Gregory the Great Day of Service.

This day will consist of five service projects with our parishioners supplying the labor to provide meals, food, toiletry kits, and diapers to area food pantries and other non-profits.

This is an event where families of all ages can participate together. It is a fantastic opportunity to demonstrate to our children the need for us to provide basic food and personal care products to those who are less fortunate.

Here is a brief description of the activities:

- We will execute an assembly line production of macaroni and cheese meals. We will take bulk items and pack them into 25,000 individual meals.
- We will collect diapers of all sizes and break them down into smaller packages that will be distributed by the Care Closet in Newport, Kentucky.
- We will pack needed hygiene item kits for men and women to be distributed at various homeless shelters.
- We will pack healthy food "power packs" that will be distributed to various schools and clubs by Inter Parish Ministry (IPM).
- We will pack bags filled with feminine products, lotion, and hand sanitizer for the "Never the Less" organization that provides programs for at risk 6th – 11th grade girls in the Tri-State area.

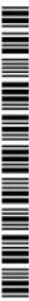
