Reflections & Ryminations... by Fr. Steve Angi

Our gospel for this Sunday, the Second Sunday of Lent, is the Transfiguration. Jesus brings His disciples away from the noise and business of the market place and takes them up a mountain. This is not unusual in itself. We know from the gospels that Jesus Himself often went to the mountain top to pray on His own. While they are on the mountain, something very strange and unusual happens. Jesus is changed in a very dramatic way; He is transformed beyond all recognition. Imagine the surprise and shock of those who were with Jesus. Yet even with this amazing experience, Peter is still able to proclaim, "Lord it is wonderful for us to be here."

As we continue our Lenten journey and Jesus continues His own journey towards Jerusalem, He knows what He is facing. He will be betrayed, denied, condemned and crucified. Perhaps He feels and senses the disciples fear and anxiety and so wants to reassure them. So He gives them a glimpse of the things to come. This brief glimpse of Jesus in all His glory is also meant for us today. Perhaps like the disciples, we too experience fear, doubt and even a lack of faith. Perhaps we, too, need to be encouraged and strengthened by Jesus, especially as we continue our journey through Lent. We, too, need to know that our prayer, fasting and almsgiving is not an end in itself or that it is all done in vain. We are heading towards the resurrection and the new life of Easter, but we have a distance to go yet. The experience of Jesus transformed offers each of us a taste of what lies ahead of us. If we share in the suffering and passion of Jesus, we will also share in his resurrection.

This is the hope in which we are asked to have faith as we make our way through Lent. When we are tempted to give up and give in, let us look to Jesus changed and transformed. May we see in Him the future that is promised to us, not only at Easter but in the fullness of God's Kingdom. As we continue to make our way through Lent, let us do what the voice of God says to each of us; "This is my Son, Listen to Him."

Take (Or Give) That Compliment! The Power of Positive Words

Is it possible that we hesitate to fully accept or give a compliment? Here's some food for thought:

- Compliments are gifts we exchange. They can be about appearance, accomplishments, personality traits or abilities. The more specific the compliment, the more seen and valued the receiver feels.
- Compliments can help both the giver and receiver feel more comfortable and connected.
- Giving a genuine compliment causes our brains to release dopamine, the neurotransmitter associated with pleasure and reward.



Taizé Prayer Service

Prayer in the spirit of the Taizé Community is a meditative form of common prayer. Gathered in the presence of Christ we sing uncomplicated, repetitive songs, uncluttered by too many words, allowing the mystery of God to become tangible through the beauty of simplicity. A few words sung over and over again reinforce the meditative quality of prayer. They express a basic reality of faith that can quickly be grasped by the intellect and gradually penetrates the whole being.




