# Reflections & Ryminations... by Fr. Steve Angi

Miracles are extraordinary and unexpected events that defy the laws or predictions of science. To believe in God is to believe in miracles and to believe in miracles is to believe in hope — even hope against all odds. God is working "miracles" every day in our lives, but we cannot presume that all of us are in tune with these "miracles". We can be so caught up in our own daily work, projects, concerns, busyness and hectic life that we relate to God as though He is only of secondary importance to us. God is working so many "miracles" in our lives daily and we take them as ordinary happenings. We will say, "I am so lucky to get this job or I managed to not break my leg during that fall down the stairs."

The question we need to be more fully conscious of today is, "Am I living my life in the deep faith of being united to God's presence or am I living my life as though I am in control of everything that goes on in my life?" If we live our daily lives in the deep and personal union with God's presence, our deep faith can give us a peace where we strongly believe that our lives are in the hands of God who cares for us. In our gospel this Sunday, Jesus provides enough food for a large number of people. We are not told this was a miracle, but it truly was. If not for Jesus, there would not have been enough food for all with leftovers.

God never fails to work "miracles" for us daily. The greater our consciousness and the deeper our gratitude to God, the more discerning we become in our relationship with Jesus. When we are able to live in such discerning ways, our life will be lived in the deep peace, joy and strength of Jesus. Living in the personal presence of Jesus is to live the most fulfilling life that nothing and no person can give. It is a life that only God, in Jesus through the Holy Spirit, can give us.


# St. John Fisher Feast Day - June 22

Sunday, June 22nd, is the annual feast day of St. John Fisher (1460-1535) and St. Thomas More. While More may be better known — having become the subject of a movie with six Academy Awards, after all — Fisher's story is also worth knowing.

John Fisher was born at Beverley, Yorkshire, England, the son of a prosperous mercer who died in 1477. About 1482 his mother sent him to Cambridge University; he was ordained in 1491 and after studying theology for ten years, he earned his D.D. (Doctorate of Divinity) in 1501 and was later recognized as one of the leading theologians of Europe.

In 1504, Fisher became bishop of Rochester, one of England's poorest dioceses, where he ruled for 30 years. He was a truly pastoral bishop, encouraging his priests by his manner of life and interest in their welfare, serving his flock with simplicity and humility. A noted and assiduous preacher, Fisher did all he could to provide well-instructed priests who could preach to the people.

Sir Thomas More and John Fisher became fast friends and colleagues during the reign of King Henry VIII, a contemptuous time for the Catholic Church in England. Both Thomas More and John Fisher are well-known for opposing King Henry's divorce from Catherine of Aragon.



They also refused to recognize King Henry's assertion as Supreme Head of the Church of England, which by doing so would deny the authority of the pope. Neither Fisher nor More could abide this claim, and their steadfastness to their consciences put them in conflict with the king. Fisher was arrested in April of 1534 and then spent more than a year imprisoned in the Tower of London on charges of treason, unable to see a confessor, and stripped of his office and his property.

In May, 1535, Fisher was made a cardinal, a move Pope Paul III hoped might secure better treatment for Fisher — to no avail. Henry VIII famously quipped when Fisher became a cardinal that "the pope can send the hat, but there will be no head to put it on." It was not an empty threat. In June, Fisher was tried by a commission and sentenced to be drawn and quartered. By some accounts, Fisher was scheduled to die on June 24 — the feast of his namesake, St. John the Baptist. When English officials began to fear that executing Fisher on John the Baptist's feast day would provoke an uprising of London Catholics, the bishop was instead beheaded on Tower Hill on June 22, 1535.

More would be executed two weeks later, on July 6. Both John Fisher and Thomas More are buried within the same church, and were canonized in 1935. On this feast day of St. John Fisher, we might consider our continued call to holiness, the call to simplicity and humility as we stand up for, and witness to, our faith in Jesus Christ as our patron saint did.
