

Reflections & Ryminations... by Fr. Steve Angi

Today is the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. These two saints are celebrated on the same day because Jesus founded his church on Saint Peter. Saint Paul was the greatest evangelist in the history of the church. These two saints were very different from each other. Each of the two Apostles had a different mission, but together they built up the church that Jesus Christ founded. We owe our Christian faith in a large part due to them. We have personally benefited from their efforts, so it is very fitting that we honor them today.

The first reading from the Acts of the Apostles clearly shows the awesome power of God, in a seemingly hopeless situation. Peter was chained up in prison with two times the normal restraints given to other prisoners, and twice the guards as well. Everyone was asleep in the dead of the night, when suddenly an angel appeared in Peter's cell. He woke him up and told him to get up quickly and put on his belt and sandals. The iron gate opened all by itself, leading him into freedom.

In today's gospel, it seems like Jesus already knew that Peter was aware of who he really was. He asked the Apostles, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" Saint Peter said, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." Jesus knew that no human person had revealed this to him, but only his Father in heaven. Jesus founded his church on love and love still guides the church. Love is not necessarily found in education, structure, formation, planning, or any other human endeavor. Love is found truly and deeply in God. The scriptures today clearly show us that God is the one in charge of our lives. It is best to look to Saint Peter as our own role model, and allow God to reveal His will to us, in His own time and own way. That was one thing Peter was good at....listening to God's voice and acting on it.

Traditionally this Solemnity is when new Archbishops receive the pallium from the Holy Father. A pallium is a white, woolen band worn by metropolitan archbishops in the Catholic Church as a symbol of their authority and as a reminder of their jurisdictional powers bestowed by the Pope. It is a vestment, typically worn over the shoulders, and is often decorated with six black crosses. Today in a ceremony in Rome with Pope Leo XIV, Archbishop Casey will receive the pallium as the Archbishop of Cincinnati. We pray for Archbishop Casey as he leads our Archdiocese.






Donating Reading Glasses at IHM

A special invitation is extended to any person with autism, developmental disabilities, Alzheimer's, dementia, sensory issues, or anyone in the deaf community.

These Masses may include lower lighting, quiet music and/or no music, scripture from the Children's Lectionary, pictorial resources, and shorter more literal homilies; however, the biggest difference is that we try to create an environment free of stigma. We encourage families and individuals to get up and move if needed, to bring alternative seating, fidgets or noise cancelling headphones, and to participate in the liturgy just as they are.


