



St. Gregory the Great Mental Wellness Minute

A Simple Practice for Inner Calm

Grounding exercises are powerful tools for improving mental wellness, especially during moments of anxiety, stress, or emotional overwhelm. This simple 5-4-3-2-1 technique uses your five senses to gently guide your attention back to the present moment. By intentionally focusing on what you see, feel, hear, smell, and taste, you begin to interrupt racing thoughts and reconnect with your surroundings. The act of sitting still, breathing deeply, and noticing your environment can calm your nervous system and reduce mental clutter. It's a way of telling your body and mind, "You are safe right now." Practicing this regularly builds resilience, enhances mindfulness, and promotes a deeper sense of peace. Grounding isn't just a coping skill—it's a daily wellness habit that nurtures calm and clarity from the inside out.

Find a quiet space and sit comfortably. Place your feet flat on the ground and take a deep breath. Look around and name five things you can see, four things you can feel, three things you can hear, two things you can smell, and one thing you can taste.

Television, movies, literature and the general media foster our awareness, and over time, our acceptance of the dark spirituality. In essence, Satan is not hiding as much today as in the past. Do we stop and ask ourselves why? What is the "plus" that makes us do these things?

Scripture warns us of the broad and easy path that leads to perdition. The "broad and easy" are the draw, along with the illusion that we are in control of ourselves, creation and the spiritual realm (which is very real and very dangerous to presume).

We must remain wary of the appeal of darkness to avoid accepting and then worshipping it in the future. God, and God alone, is to receive our worship. The pathway He sets out for us is narrow and sometimes difficult, but it leads to light and eternal life, rather than darkness and eternal death. Stay awake, stay aware and stay faithful. Deacon Bob
